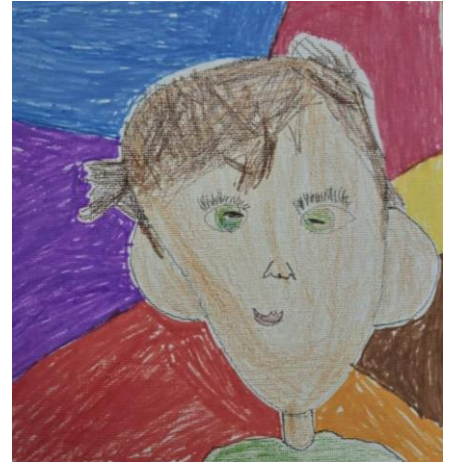

Nut Allergy – Polite Reminder

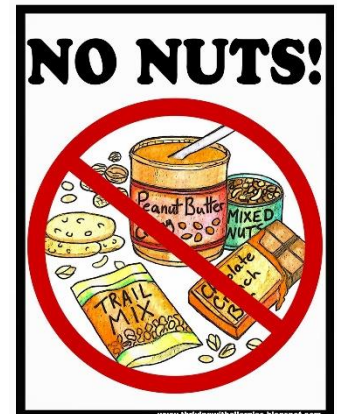

What is the MTC?

The Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) is a national assessment for Year 4 students in the UK. It ensures children have a secure grasp of their times tables, which are fundamental to their mathematical development. The check consists of questions on multiplication tables up to 12 and helps identify areas where students may need additional support.

How to Sign Up: Please sign up for the workshop through Arbor. Your participation will greatly benefit your child's mathematical journey.

Note for Year 3 Parents: Although the MTC is for Year 4 pupils, we encourage parents of Year 3 children to start thinking about it now. Early preparation can significantly boost your child's confidence and performance.
