



## Frisby CE Primary School PE and Sports

### Premium 2024-25

#### What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

This funding will be ring fenced, and will be allocated directly to primary schools across England, providing them with dedicated resource to buy in invaluable expertise and support. Funding will be allocated through a lump sum for each, Frisby C of E Primary will receive a lump sum of £17,000.00. #### Purpose of funding

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. This means that you should use the premium to: develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers and/or make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

For example, you can use your funding to:

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools

## **How will we be spending the Sports Premium and who will benefit?**

The Governors agree that the money must be used so that: all children benefit regardless of sporting ability; that the higher attaining children are given the opportunity to compete in advanced tournaments; that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development. We also agree that all children should be encouraged to develop healthy lifestyles.
