










By the end of their time at Frisby Church of England Primary School all pupils will have been given the opportunity to...

Opportunity	When?	Values
<p>Be part of our Junior Leadership Team Every child in Year 6 has the opportunity to be a part of the Junior Leadership Team. Members meet regularly and are responsible for supporting the Senior Leadership Team with whole school events – such as World Book Day, McMillan Coffee Morning, Comic Relief and Children in Need.</p>	Each half term	  
<p>Be part of our Christian Ethos Team (NYLG group) Pupils meet regularly. Their main responsibility is to enhance reflections areas across the school, support with planning Collective Worship and monitoring reflections made by pupils about Worship. They will also have the opportunity to deliver Worship in school and church. They take responsibility for developing a reflection area in each classroom.</p>	Annually	  





<p>Be Sports Ambassadors Year 5/6 will all be trained as Sports Leaders. A number of pupils are then selected and their responsibility will be to come up with a plan and run lunchtime games and activities aimed to suit the whole school. This will be overseen by the Lunchtime supervisors.</p>	Annually	
<p>Be a House Captain The House Captains at Frisby C of E Primary School are the oldest pupils in that particular house group – Oak, Ash, Elm, Willow and Birch. They are our school leaders during Sports Day, House events and other school events, and elected to represent their house by the younger children in their house group.</p>	Annually	
<p>Take part in a Residential trip All Year 5 and Year 6 pupils will have the opportunity to attend a 2-night residential trip.</p>	Year 5 and Year 6	
<p>Take part in a Residential trip All Year 3 and Year 4 pupils will have the opportunity to attend a 1-night 'sleep over' away from home.</p>	Years 3 and 4	
<p>Educational trips All pupils will be invited on at least one Educational Trip per academic year.</p>	At least annually	
<p>Visit a place of worship Pupils at Frisby C of E Primary school will have the opportunity to visit St Thomas's Church in Frisby and at least one other place of worship during their time at school.</p>	At least 4 times a year	
<p>Sporting events Pupils at Frisby C of E school will be invited to take part in various inclusive events throughout the year, in conjunction with Melton and Belvoir Sports and Physical Activity Network. Interschool competitions will also take place alongside competitions within our RISE family of schools.</p>	Throughout the year.

Some of these events are school based, some in clusters and some are all of Rise coming together. <p>Sky Theatre Pupils in KS2 will be given the opportunity to take part in a local dancing event at the theatre in Melton Mowbray. This performance will take place once a year and will be alongside other local primary schools.</p>		
<p>Arts Award Whole school participation in Arts Award administered by Trinity College. All children create their own portfolio of artwork, working towards a nationally recognized award. Forms part of D of E award (ASDAN).</p>	All year groups	
<p>Music lessons Pupils at Frisby C of E Primary school are given the opportunity to learn to play the piano or guitar during their time at our school. Pupils will work with the Leicestershire Music Service to learn a musical instrument (violin) for at least one year in Key Stage 2.</p>	Throughout the year. 3 terms	

<p>Hot Potato Club The children in year 6 attend the local run group for older residents of the village</p>	Year 6	
<p>Choir The children who wish to take part in the school choir are given the opportunity to sing at the Melton Mowbray town Christmas light switch on, and for the local community at the village lights switch on.</p>	KS 2	
<p>Recycling monitors Several children are responsible for ensuring the wastepaper is recycled.</p>	Year 6	
<p>Year 6 buddies When the Reception children start their time at Frisby, a year 6 pupil is paired up with them during the first term. This is to show the new children where to play, place lunch boxes, how to move around the school, which toilets etc.</p>	Year 6	
<p>Lunch time helpers Several year 6 children help the staff in the hall to hand out food, plates, cutlery etc. and support the younger children.</p>	Year 6	
<p>Bus Registers Children take responsibility for taking the bus register after lunch to all the classes.</p>	Year 6	
<p>Wet play classroom helpers Several year 6 children help in the classrooms during wet play time doing small tasks for the teacher and supporting the children as they come in.</p>	Year 6	

<p>Milk and fruit distributors Children take out the milk and fruit to the playground for others to have at break time</p>	Year 6	
<p>Themed Weeks/Days Children across the school have the opportunity to take part in different, inspiring themed events. (Science, Mental Health, World Book Day, World Art Day, 500 words)</p>	Whole School	
<p>Extra-Curricular activities Pupils in every year group will have the opportunity to take part in extra-curricular activities which run at lunchtimes, before or after school.</p>	Throughout the year.	

Personal Development scrapbooks
Pupils at Frisby Primary School will have weekly opportunities to reflect on the school's key values and the content delivered during Collective Worship in their year group Reflection journals. This book will follow them through the school and is not 'marked' by school staff.
