Collective Worship Take Home

In Collective Worship this week, we have been thinking about how McDonald's have changed the colours of its famous Happy Meal box in the UK, making it white on three sides, for children to colour and design themselves. The company said the new boxes encourage creativity and let children express their ideas and feelings through drawing. Four million of the new 'colour-your-own' boxes have been given out as a trial to see how children respond.

Things you could talk about at home:

- Talk to someone at home about the campaign. Share your thoughts – do you think it reflects Christian values such as kindness, generosity, and love for others? How might your design on the box show these values?
- One of the aims of the campaign is to encourage children to express themselves. Do you believe it helps children share their God-given gifts and creativity? Can you think of any other ideas that would help children live out values such as compassion and service?



Uniform Expectations Reminder

As we approach the end of term, we have noticed an observable increase in the number of children not adhering to the school's uniform policy. We understand that some pupils may have outgrown items and that replacing these can be costly in the run-up to Christmas. With this in mind, we truly appreciate the efforts families are making to keep pupils looking smart during this busy time.

From the start of the new year, we do expect all children to be dressed in the correct school uniform and to have the appropriate PE kit with them on the days it is required. This includes:

School Uniform

- Emerald green sweatshirt or cardigan
- White or emerald green shirt/blouse or polo shirt
- Plain grey trousers, formal shorts, skirt, pinafore dress, or culottes
- Green/white gingham summer dress (optional in warmer months)
- Grey, black or white socks/tights
- Footwear: Plain black shoes/boots in a formal style

PE Kit

- Emerald green or white t-shirt
- Plain black shorts, tracksuit bottoms or leggings
- Emerald green or plain black hoodie
- Flat trainers/plimsolls

Kit should be stored in school in a clearly named bag.
