Collective Worship Take Home

In Collective Worship this week, we have been thinking about how adults in the UK are talking about whether children under 16 should be allowed to use social media, as the government is considering new rules to help keep children safe online. Some people believe social media helps children stay connected, while others worry it can affect wellbeing and mental health. During Children's Mental Health Week, the story reminds us how important it is to look after our mental health both online and offline.



Things you could talk about at home:

WONDER (Looking out at the world)

- How can Christian principles - such as love, respect, and kindness - guide the ways families use technology to help everyone feel safe and protected?

REFLECT (Looking inwards at ourselves)

- What choices can we make online that show Christian values and how might these choices shape the way we behave differently from others in our homes or communities?

DO (Responding through actions and choices)

- What choices can we make online that show Christian values - such as honesty, compassion, and gratitude - and how might these choices shape the way we behave differently from others in our homes or communities?

Being in school every day really does make a difference: pupils who attend regularly benefit from better learning outcomes, stronger friendships, and greater confidence in their daily routines.

Below is our year-to-date attendance picture for each year group:

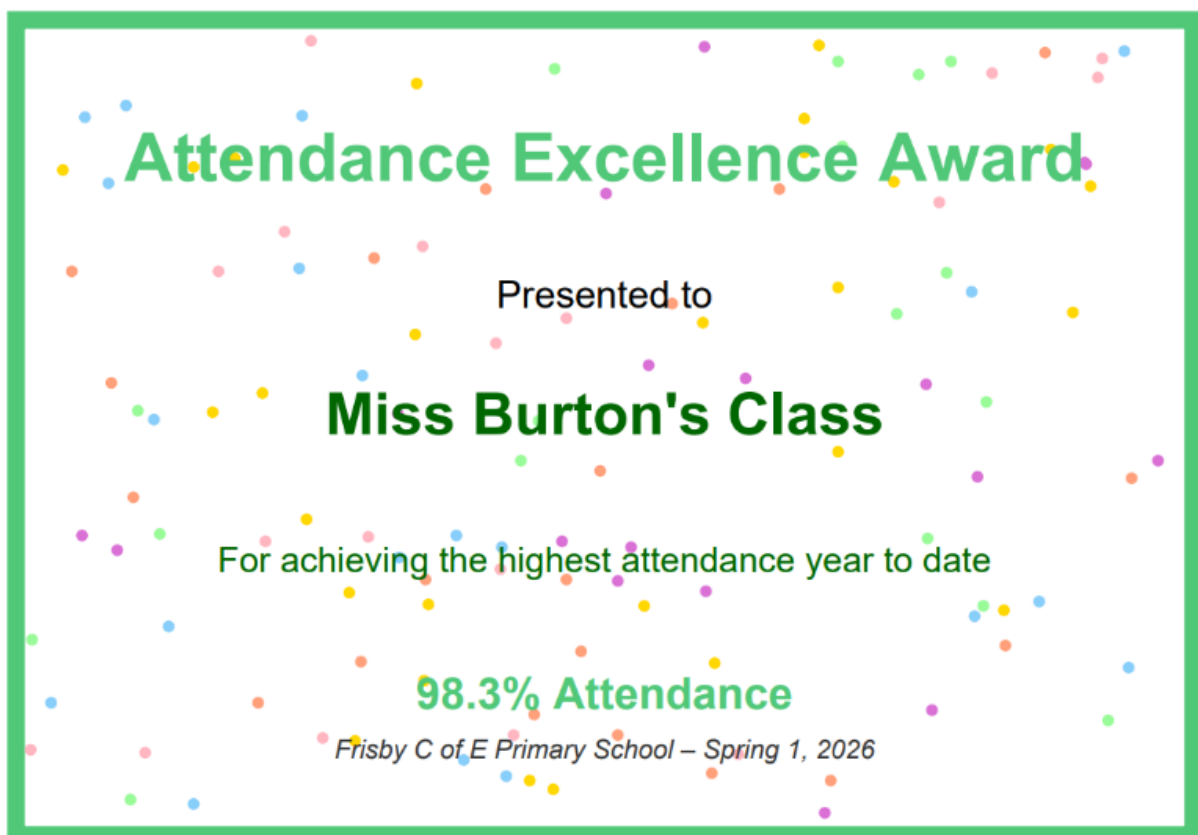
- Year R: 98.3%
