## Collective Worship Take Home

In Collective Worship this week, we have been thinking about how scientists at NASA are preparing to send astronauts back to the Moon, as part of a new space programme running over the coming years. The series of missions aims to test new technology, learn more about the Moon, and help humans prepare for future journeys deeper into space. The next mission is Artemis II. The plans have sparked discussions about why people explore space and how they could help life on Earth.



Things you could talk about at home:

### **WONDER** (Looking out at the world)

- As we look at God's creation, what do you already know about space or the Moon? What do you wonder about when you think of the vastness and beauty of the universe that God has made?

### **REFLECT** (Looking inwards at ourselves)

- Christians believe that God encourages us to be curious and courageous. Why do you think people choose to explore space, even when it is difficult or risky? What does this teach us about human hope, perseverance, and seeking truth?

### **DO** (Responding through actions and choices)

- If you could explore anywhere beyond Earth, where would you go and why? How might you use what you discover to help others or to care for God's world?

### Visit from Road Safety Education

On Friday, we were delighted to welcome the Road Safety Education Team into school for a full day of engaging, hands-on learning linked to the Leicestershire Road Safety Education Programme. Their visit aimed to help children develop the knowledge and confidence they need to keep themselves safe when travelling in their local community.

Throughout the morning, the team spent time with every class, delivering age-appropriate sessions designed to build essential road-safety awareness. Children across the school explored themes such as recognising safe places to cross, understanding how to use roads and pavements responsibly, thinking about distractions, practising safety routines like the Green Cross Code, and developing awareness of how to travel more safely as they grow older. Content ranged from early introductions to basic road-crossing steps for our youngest pupils, through to developing independence, mindfulness and responsible decision-making for our older learners.



The Road Safety Team praised the children for their excellent engagement, thoughtful questions and enthusiasm throughout the visit. We are proud of how well our pupils represented the school and grateful to the Road Safety Education Team for providing such valuable learning experiences that support children's wellbeing and safety now and for the future.
