Collective Worship Take Home

In Collective Worship this week, we have been thinking about how athletes from around the world have been competing in the Winter Paralympic Games in Italy. The Paralympics are an international sporting event for athletes with disabilities. This year's competitors took part in events such as skiing, snowboarding, wheelchair curling, and ice hockey. Many athletes train for years to compete at this level. Some have overcome injuries or health challenges, while others were born with disabilities. Using specialised equipment and incredible determination, they compete for medals.

Things you could talk about at home:

WONDER (Looking out at the world)

- Ask someone at home who inspires them in sport and why. How do they see Christian qualities shown through that person's actions?

REFLECT (Looking inwards at ourselves)

- What does being a 'champion' mean to you when you think about Jesus' teachings—such as loving others, showing kindness, and using your gifts well?

DO (Responding through actions and choices)

- Choose one Christian value you admire in a sporting role model and try to show that value in your daily life this week (e.g., patience, fairness, compassion).
