WONDER (Looking out at the world)

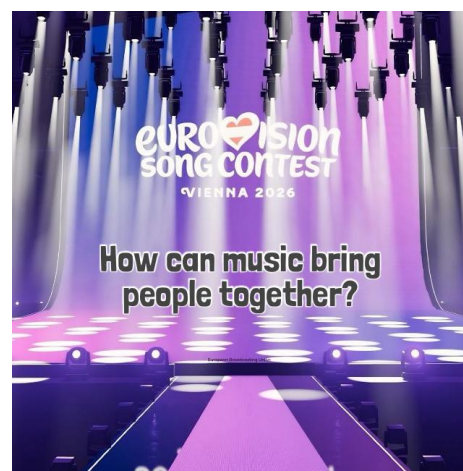
- Why might events like international music competitions encourage unity and peace between nations?

- Do you believe music always brings people together, or can it sometimes cause disagreement? How does Jesus teach us to respond when opinions differ?

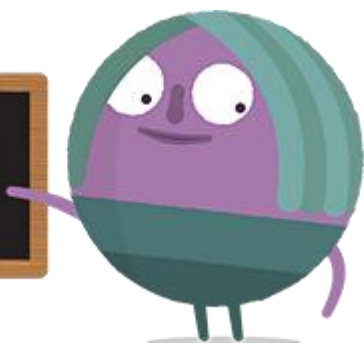
DO (Responding through actions and choices)
