WONDER (Looking out at the world)

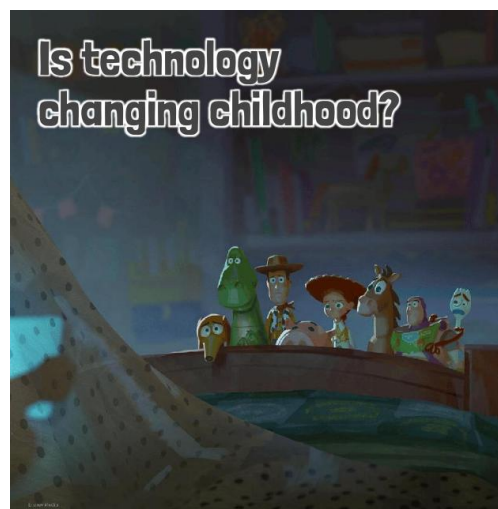
- I wonder how technology and traditional toys can both be used in ways that show wisdom and thankfulness for God's gifts?
