Visit of Bishop Bethuel



On Tuesday, we were delighted to welcome Bishop Bethuel to our school for a memorable and inspiring visit. He shared insights into life in Tanzania and helped the children learn about the experiences of pupils at Kiteto Christian College, giving them a valuable glimpse into school life in a different part of the world. Through stories, photographs and discussion, pupils learned about daily routines, education and community life in the Kiteto region, an area well known for its strong Maasai heritage.

The children thoroughly enjoyed learning about Christianity from a different perspective and were fascinated by the similarities and differences between their own experiences and those of children at Kiteto Christian College.

Highlights included learning songs, counting in Swahili, and exploring a range of artefacts from Tanzanian culture.

A particular favourite was discovering more about the Maasai people. Pupils were captivated by their traditions, clothing and way of life, and loved the opportunity to handle and discuss objects connected to this unique culture. The visit helped bring their learning to life and deepened their understanding of Christianity as a global faith community.

We are very grateful to Bishop Bethuel for sharing his faith, knowledge and experiences with us. The visit was a rich and authentic learning experience, encouraging curiosity, respect and appreciation for different cultures, and leaving the children excited about the possibility of developing links with schools and communities in Tanzania in the future.
